



Energy Saving Guide When Operating in a Building at Kibblestone International Scout Camp.

For a Budgeting guide ONLY.

To aid our customers with their budgeting prior to camp preparations, we are analysed our historic database of users to see if an average could be drawn.

A calculation for 24hrs at the rate of purchase at time of print (Sept 2010) is as follows – *please be aware that we continue to source the cheapest energy possible.*

Electric should be between £50 and £70.

Gas should be between £7 and £12.

To help achieve these operating costs or lower, we suggest some “ENERGY SAVING TIPS”.

Appoint an “ENERGY SAVING CHAMPION”; someone to help you stop wasting energy.

- 1) Operate each room of the building with the following tips in mind.
- 2) Always operate with Health & Safety of those in your care at all times but switch off all un-necessary lights where possible. Only light a room when it is in use.
- 3) Only use heaters “thriftyly”. Do you really need heating when the weather is good? – When the heaters are on try and keep all doors and windows closed.
- 4) Do not use the gas cookers as a heating devise in the kitchen.
- 5) Do not leave hot water taps running when not in use.
- 6) Shower on time! If you were using a token it would only last one minute!
- 7) When you are nearing the end of your visit and have finished using Energy, arrange with Reception to have the water heaters switched off in the wash rooms. *(Please note - this request must be made to the Camp Site Manager at reception with at least two hours notice of the switching off time to get the fullest advantage and saving of this.)*
