Glasses should be removed. • Users must not; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - consume food or drink on the structure - obstruct the entrance/exit - play on the apron around the structure - hang or climb on the walls • Instructor to stop activity immediately should any of the following occur <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Weather conditions deteriorate - Group is too large or unruly to supervise - No adult supervision provided by the group ▪ Structure to be deflated and placed out-of-bounds when not in use. 	4	1	4L
